Research Stakeholders Workshop

Workshop with ERA-NETs and JPIs

FORESTERRA Workshop on Strategics Activities (Tunisia, June 2012): The event aimed to introduce Foresterra to a large cross-section of the Mediterranean forest research community and to draw a scientific plan.

- •More than **90 participants** attending the FORESTERRA workshop, including other Mediterranean Climate Areas. From **Australia** Jerry Vanclay, Southern Cross University and from **California** Keith Gilless, University of California College of Natural Resources of Berkeley
- •Four cross-cutting themes were discussed, through interactive and iterative group work.
- •Drafts strategic document produced, disseminated to EFIMED's network of over 800 stakeholders for additional comments.



FORESTERRA Workshop for exchanging information regarding the mapping exercises (Rome, October 2012)

- Exchange of information regarding existing research programmes and capacities among partners, among countries and with relevant stakeholders
- To exploit the results of the mapping exercises (Task 2.1 and 2.2)
- After the workshop, the deliverable 2.4 "Report on the mapping and characterisation of existing funding programmes and research capacities" was produced.
- A summary was disseminated to EFIMED's network of over 800 stakeholders by the newsletter and it is available at the FORESTERRA Website.







Workshop with relevant ERA-Nets and JPIs (Barcelona, September 2013)

- Opening session which was attended by over 100 leading researchers, practitioners and policy makers in Mediterranean forestry (in coincidence with EFIMED Annual Meeting)
- The strategic themes of FORESTERRA were presented, alongside synergies and the impacts of research with other related initiatives.
- Some EFIMED network members made presentations or posters on their institution / project / activity in relation to one of the four FORESTERRA strategic themes.
- Participants had the opportunity to network and take steps towards building trans-national consortia for the forthcoming calls for proposals.
- FORESTERRA maximized synergies and the impacts of research not only with other related initiatives, but also with other Mediterranean Climate Areas,
 - in order to promote joint activities and exchange of information.

Theme1: Global Change

"Understanding global change drivers, impacts & indicators on forest ecosystems: a Mediterranean-scale approach"

- i. to understand, analyze and map the main global changes
- ii. to forecast the provision of ecosystem good and services
- iii. to identify main risks and hotspot areas requiring special attention
- iv. to develop an integrated forest information system as basis for developing new adaptive strategies and policies



Theme 2: Biodiversity

"Fostering forest system resilience through managing biodiversity, from genes to communities"

- (i) functional, structural and evolutionary response of Mediterranean forests as affected by socio-ecological changes
- (ii) New adaptive management models and tools taking into account the role of forest biodiversity (genes-communities)
- (iii) Valuation, financing and policy frameworks that will support the conservation of biodiversity resources and the implementation of adaptive forest management.



Theme 3: Multipurpose landscapes

"Management of multi-purpose landscapes to enhance the role of NWFPs and ecosystem services in rural development"

- (i) Production potential and trade-offs
- (ii) Tools to optimise the the joint production of wood, NWFPs and Environmental Servies.
- (iii) Markets for NWFPs and ES
- (iv) Including Stakeholder
- (v) to analyse and enhance the market value and governance structures



Theme 4: Water

"4Integrated watershed management for delivering forest water-related services"

- (i) understanding of the trade-offs between water and other forest ecosystem services at different scales
- (ii) forest-to-basin level management models that contribute to CC adaptation, water harvesting...
- (iii) PES and PES like instruments and policies;
- (v) Governance models that support fair access and sustainable use for forest water resources.
- (vi) water use in restoration and forestation





Forest and Water a hot topic in Australia

15% decline in precipitation = 85% decline in watershed output

Wester Australia (Perth)

1970s:

- 80% surface water
- 20% underground water

2010s:

- 5% surface water
- 60% underground water
- 35% desalination





Forest and Water a hot topic in Australia

Managing forest for water could increase watershed output and produce revenues of AUS\$ 1.000 based on price of water... but...


Forest and Water a hot topic in Australia
